Commentary and Analysis: Ross Glen School continues to maintain an excellent quality of education and increased in the 2023-2024 school year. As we implement new curriculum in several subject areas, our focus on maintaining a high quality of education is key as we assess students and plan accordingly to improve their learning. During the 2022-2023 school year, we implemented our ROSGO behaviour matrix, which brought extra attention to areas, such as citizenship. During the implementation year, parents perceived a low level of citizenship, while students maintained the same perspective as the previous couple of years. During the 2023-2024 school year, as students and parents are aware of the expectations, the result improved as indicated by increased results by all 3 groups; students, parents and teachers. Parental involvement continued to drop for the second year in a row. However, Ross Glen School Council developed committees to plan events/fundraisers/hot lunch and were successful with recruiting new parents.

Commentary and Analysis: We saw a dramatic increase in the Citizenship results. In the previous year, parents reported a low achievement which highlighted this area to be an issue. During the 2023-2024 school year, we focused on bringing more awareness to our school community about our ROSGO behaviour matrix to highlight all the great ways students were modeling the characteristics of active citizenship. The response of students also increased from Intermediate to High demonstrating that students could also see and feel the difference within the school. We had a very active Student Leadership group that enhanced our school community by being active citizens and modeling those traits. This area is an area to celebrate as we went from being an Issue to Good overall.

Commentary and Analysis: The amount of grade 4-6 students engaged in their learning increased. The evaluation by parents decreased. This might have been a result of using EDSBY as a tool to communicate students' learning to parents. Teachers continued to report students as being engaged in their learning.

Commentary and Analysis: All stakeholders continued to be highly satisfied with the overall quality of basic education at Ross Glen School, with all 3 stakeholders results increasing. The teachers' rating increased which could be a result of the increased professional development around new curriculum and research-based teaching strategies. Teachers indicated their professional development opportunities met what they were needing. Our school goal focused on literacy, with small group instruction as a strategy allowing a way to meet individual students' learning needs. The student result also increased, which moved Ross Glen from an Intermediate to High Achievement, which resulted in a Good overall evaluation which increased from Acceptable.

Commentary and Analysis: Results by all 3 stakeholder groups increased. This could be a result of an increased focus on sense of belonging as a school goal. Our Apple School's facilitator worked to increase a sense of belonging focusing on our school mascot and reminding students "We are ROADRUNNDERS!" Parents would have also heard this messaging at school assemblies. In addition, the continued focus on and promotion of our ROSGO behaviour matrix, including highlighting students who demonstrate Respect, Open-heartedness, Safety, a Growth Mindset and Ownership, may have helped to change parent and student perceptions about the school culture.

Commentary and Analysis: Although we "Maintained" on this measure, we saw a relative increase reported by all stakeholders. Parents, in particular, showed the greatest increase, rising to 72.7 from 46.6 the previous school year. The Overall measure increased from 67.8 to 78.1. This increase could be the result of teachers and our CST providing increased communication about the supports students are receiving, as well as increased communication provided by the school FSLW. Teacher confidence in providing needed support has also likely increased as a result of targeted professional learning in literacy and numeracy.

Commentary and Analysis: Parents responded that parental involvement increased, which went from 69.7% to 78.8%, which is a very high measure. However, teachers reported a decrease in parent involvement, going from 90.9% to 77.8% resulting in a Very Low achievement and bringing the teacher result to an area of concern. This will be an area that will be investigated with teachers to determine how, in their perspective, this area might improve.
